Defendant and Cross-Complainant City of San Buenaventura (Ventura) submits this response to the Statement re City Refusal to Produce Expert Documents/Materials filed by Andrew K. Whitman, et al. (Whitman). The Whitman statement is based on a false premise. Ventura has not "refused" to produce its expert's model, in fact, Whitman has yet to even ask for it. As Whitman's statement makes clear, he has indicated that he might want it in the future, and if he does, he does not want to have to go into Court to add himself to the Stipulation and Protective Order. That is fine with Ventura, and if Whitman wants a copy of the model, Ventura will provide him an electronic transfer, provided he signs the Stipulation and Protective Order.

However, by this response, Ventura makes one request of Whitman, which should apply to any other party who, like Whitman, does not have an expert, but for whatever reason wishes to have a copy of the model. Ventura's request is that Whitman, and any others who are similarly situated, confirm that they have ArcGIS software or a Graphical User Interface (GUI) for modeling loaded onto the computers on which they would like to view and analyze the model.

It is Ventura's understanding that in order to view all of the model input files and the maps depicting the model components, the computer on which the model is located needs to have software known as ArcGIS, or at least a GUI. As Ventura understands, ArcGIS software has specific and highly technical mapping features that allow a user to prepare and/or view the maps that are a part of the model. GUI software is not comparable to ArcGIS, but it at least provides a way to view the model grid, and the model's inputs and outputs. These software packages are commonly used by engineers and other technical professionals, like hydrogeologists, but are not commonly used by other types of professionals, like lawyers, and they are not standard software that is preloaded onto computers sold at retail. If Whitman's computer does not have ArcGIS software, or at least a GUI, he will likely not be able to examine or otherwise view any of the model components in any kind of meaningful way. He will be able to see spreadsheets of inputted data, however, this data will have no context. There will be a lot of numbers on a page, but the numbers will not correspond to any of the locations in any of the surface watercourses or groundwater basins at issue. If a party wants access to the model and does not have ArcGIS or at least at GUI, Ventura questions what litigation purpose this could possibly have.
