TO THIS HONORABLE COURT AND TO ALL PARTIES AND THEIR ATTORNEYS OF RECORD:

Respondent and Cross-Complainant, City of San Buenaventura ("CITY") hereby applies for an Order directing that an Order to Show Cause hearing be set to obtain an order for service of the Summons of the Third Amended Cross-Complaint for Violation of Reasonable Use; Violation of Public Trust; Declaratory Relief – Pueblo and/or Treaty Water Rights; Declaratory Relieve – Prescriptive Water Rights; Declaratory Relief – Appropriative Water Rights; Comprehensive Adjudication; Declaratory Relief – Municipal Priority; Declaratory Relief – Human Right to Water and Declaratory Relief filed in this action on January 2, 2020 (hereinafter "Third Amended Cross Complaint") on the heirs and devisees of four cross-defendants named in this action, who are deceased but for whom successors could not be located and one unserved Cross-Defendants behind gate and fence, by publication in a newspaper of general circulation, pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 415.50.

This Application is made on the ground that the heirs and devisees of Cross-Defendants indicated above have an interest in real property (the "Properties"), which are subject to the Court's jurisdiction. However, as outlined below, CITY has been unsuccessful in locating successors in interest to the deceased Cross-Defendants in order to serve the third amended cross-complaint as specified in Code of Civil Procedure sections 415.10 through 415.30 for more than a year. In addition the CITY has been unable to serve one unserved Cross-Defendants behind gate and fence for more than a year as specified in Code of Civil Procedure Sections 415.10 through 415.30. Thus, CITY respectfully requests that this Court issue an order for service of the Summons by publication on the heirs and devisees and one Cross-Defendant behind gate and fence.

CITY also applies for an Order allowing service of its Summons to the Third Amended Cross-Complaint and supporting documents on Cross-Defendant Shanks Investment Group LLC, by serving the California Secretary of State, and that such Order be allowed without hearing.

CITY's Application is based on this Application, the attached Memorandum of Points and Authorities, the declaration of Marnie Prock, and the complete files and records in this action.

MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

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Respondent and Cross-Complainant, City of San Buenaventura ("CITY") hereby applies for an Order directing that an Order to Show Cause hearing be set to obtain a final order re service of the Summons of the Third Amended Cross-Complaint for Violation of Reasonable Use; Violation of Public Trust; Declaratory Relief - Pueblo and/or Treaty Water Rights; Declaratory Relieve - Prescriptive Water Rights; Declaratory Relief - Appropriative Water Rights; Comprehensive Adjudication; Declaratory Relief - Municipal Priority; Declaratory Relief - Human Right to Water and Declaratory Relief filed in this action on January 2, 2020 (hereinafter "Third Amended Cross Complaint") on the heirs and devisees of four deceased Cross-Defendants named in this action which remain unserved because successors in interest to the four deceased Cross-Defendants cannot be located. The CITY also seeks to serve two remaining unserved Cross-Defendants located behind gate and fence. The CITY seeks an Order from the Court allowing for service by publication in a newspaper of general circulation for the heirs and devisees of Cross-Defendants and on one unserved Cross-Defendant behind gate and fence, pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 415.50. Service on these unserved Cross-Defendants is requested to be by publication pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 415.50 in the Ventura County Star, which is a newspaper of general circulation in the County of Ventura which is the location of the properties. This newspaper is the one most likely to give notice to the heirs and devisees of Cross-Defendants because it is the major newspaper covering the area wherein the Properties at issue in this case lie, and therefore where these Cross-Defendants are residing. (Code Civ. Proc., § 415.50, subd. (b).)

CITY has also been unable to effectuate service of process on Shanks Investment Group, LLC in the manner provided in Code of Civil Procedure Sections 415.10, 415.20, 415.30, 416.10(a)-(c) and 416.40, although CITY has made diligent efforts to do so, this Cross-Defendant's Agent for Service of Process is behind a locked gate and fence. Having exhausted all reasonable efforts to serve Shanks Investment Group LLC, CITY respectfully requests that this Court order service of the Summons, Third Amended Cross Complaint and related pleadings

on Shanks Investment Group LLC, by delivery to the California Secretary of State, together with a copy of the order authorizing such service.

A copy of the Summons and Third Amended Cross-Complaint could not be served on those Cross-Defendants listed in Exhibit "A" by any of the following methods:

- 1. Handing a copy to the person to be served. (Personal service Code Civ. Proc., § 415.10).
- 2. Leaving a copy, during usual office hours and in the office of the person to be served, with the person who apparently was in charge and by thereafter mailing copies (by first class mail, postage prepaid) to the person to be served at the place where the copies were left. (Service on a corporation, partnership, association, or public entity Code Civ. Proc., § 415.20(a)).
- 3. Leaving a copy at the dwelling house, usual place of abode, or usual place of business of the person to be served in the presence of a competent member of the household or person apparently in charge of his office or place of business, at least 18 years of age, who shall be informed of the general nature of the papers and by thereafter mailing copies (by first class mail, postage prepaid) to the person to be served at the place where the copies were left. (Service on natural person, minor, incompetent, or candidate Code Civ. Proc., § 415.20(b)).
- 4. Sending (by first class mail or airmail) a copy to the person to be served, together with two copies of required form of notice and acknowledgement and a return envelope, postage prepaid, addressed to the sender. (Service by mail Code Civ. Proc., § 415.30).
- 5. Any other method (Code Civ. Proc., §§ 413.10, 413.30).

 (See Declaration of Marnie Prock ("Prock Decl."), filed concurrently herewith.) CITY seeks an order from the Court to publish the Summons of its Third Amended Cross-Complaint for the subject properties which remain owned by said deceased Cross-Defendants and which successors in interest cannot be located and as to one unserved Cross-Defendant behind gate and fence. As discussed herein, service of the Summons by publication is proper because each of the heirs and devisees of Cross-Defendants or Cross-Defendants have an interest in the Property, which is subject to the Court's jurisdiction. (See Code Civ. Proc. § 415.50, subds. (a)(1)-(2).) Additionally,

CITY has exhausted all reasonable efforts to locate such heirs and devisees of Cross-Defendants in any other manner or serve such Cross-Defendants as specified in Code of Civil Procedure sections 415.10 through 415.30. Thus, CITY seeks to serve the heirs and devisees of Cross-Defendants, and one Cross-Defendant behind gate and fence by publication pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 415.50 so that it may proceed with this Action.

CITY has also been unable to effectuate service of process on Shanks Investment Group, LLC in the manner provided in Code of Civil Procedure Sections 415.10, 415.20, 415.30, 416.10(a)-(c) and 416.40, and respectfully requests that this Court order service of the Summons, Third Amended Cross Complaint and related pleadings on Shanks Investment Group LLC, by delivery to the California Secretary of State, together with a copy of the order authorizing such service.

II. <u>LEGAL STANDARD FOR SERVICE BY PUBLICATION</u>

A party may effectuate service by publication when it appears to the satisfaction of the Court that a party to be served cannot with reasonable diligence be served by another method specified in Code of Civil Procedure sections 415.10 through 415.30. Reasonable diligence requires a "thorough systematic investigation and inquiry conducted in good faith by that party, agent or attorney." (*Watts v. Crawford* (1995) 10 Cal.4th 743, 749, n. 5 [citations omitted].)

In addition to the reasonable diligence requirement, the Court must also find the following:

- (1) A cause of action exists against the party upon whom service is to be made or he or she is a necessary or proper party to the action.
- (2) The party to be served has or claims an interest in real or personal property in this state that is subject to the jurisdiction of the court.

(Code Civ. Proc., § 415.50, subd (a)(1)-(2).) Upon completion of service by publication, service of the summons is deemed complete as required by Government Code section 6064. (Code Civ. Proc., § 415.50, subd. (c).) All requisite facts are present to afford the Court authority to issue an order for publication of the Summons pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 415.50.

III. <u>LEGAL STANDARD FOR SERVICE OF PROCESS ON THE SECRETARY OF STATE</u>

Service on a limited liability company is effectuated by serving the person designated as its agent for service of process. (Corp. Code § 17701.16(b).) The designated agent may be served either by personal service (Code Civ. Proc. § 415.10), or service by mail with acknowledgment of receipt. (Code Civ. Proc. § 415.30(a).) However, if the plaintiff is unable to serve a defendant by these methods, the plaintiff may file an affidavit showing that the designated agent has resigned or cannot be located, or that service cannot be effectuated by the abovementioned methods. Upon receipt of plaintiff's affidavit, the court may order service of process as to the non-served defendant business entity by delivery to the Secretary of State, together with a copy of the order authorizing such service. (Corp. Code §§ 1702, 17701.16(c)(1)).

Here, this Court should order service on Shanks Investment Group LLC's Agent for Service of Process, which cannot be served because the property is surrounded by gate and fence. (Prock Decl. ¶ 9, 10.) CITY has attempted numerous times to serve the current identified Agent for Service of Process at the addresses indicated on the Secretary of State website. (Prock Decl. ¶ 10, 13.) As part of its efforts to effectuate service, CITY retained First Legal ("First Legal") to serve Shanks Investment Group LLC among other unserved Cross-Defendants. (Prock Decl. ¶ 6.) First Legal was able to effectuate service of process because the address listed for the Agent for Service of Process is located behind gate and fence. (Prock Decl. ¶ 9, 10.) Thus, based on a thorough and systematic investigation in good faith, CITY cannot with reasonable diligence locate or serve Shanks Investment Group LLC.

CITY respectfully requests that the Court grant an Order allowing it to serve a copy of the Summons, Third Amended Cross Complaint, and supporting pleadings on Shanks Investment Group LLC by delivery to the California Secretary of State, in order that CITY be able complete its more than eighteenth month service of process of this Cross-Defendant.

IV. SERVICE BY PUBLICATION IS APPROPRIATE BECAUSE CITY HAS EXHAUSTED ALL REASONABLE EFFORTS TO LOCATE KNOWN SUCCESSORS IN INTEREST TO SUCH DECEASED CROSS- DEFENDANTS OR CROSSDEFENDANTS BEHIND GATES AND FENCES

Based on a thorough and systematic investigation in good faith, CITY cannot with reasonable diligence serve the Cross-Defendants listed in Exhibit "A", other than by publication. Specifically, CITY has conducted exhaustive research through the Ventura County Assessor records, real property records and TLO searches of records related to successor in interest or heirs and devises of Cross-Defendants which own the properties or alternative addresses in which to serve the Cross-Defendants behind gate and fence at issue. These efforts all proved unsuccessful, and the CITY therefore seeks an order for publication pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 415.50.

V. PUBLICATION IN VENTURA COUNTY STAR IS APPROPRIATE

Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 415.50, subdivision (c), the duration of the publication of the summons is determined by Government Code section 6064, which provides:

Publication of notice pursuant to this section shall be once a week for four successive weeks. Four publications in a newspaper regularly published once a week or oftener, with at least five days intervening between publication dates, are sufficient. The period of notice commences with the first day of publication and terminates at the end of the twenty-eighth day, including therein the first day.

The Ventura County Star is a newspaper of general circulation published and distributed in Ventura County, where the Property is located, and which is most likely to give actual notice of the pendency of the proceedings herein to the heirs and devisees of Cross-Defendants and gated and fenced Cross-Defendant. (Prock Decl., ¶ 17.)

VI. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

Based on the foregoing, CITY respectfully requests that:

1. The Court issue an order to set an order to show cause hearing regarding an order for publication of the Summons as to the heirs and devisees of Cross-Defendants and one unserved Cross-Defendants behind gate and fence listed in Exhibit "A", and allow CITY to serve
